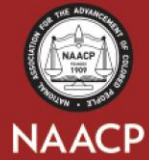

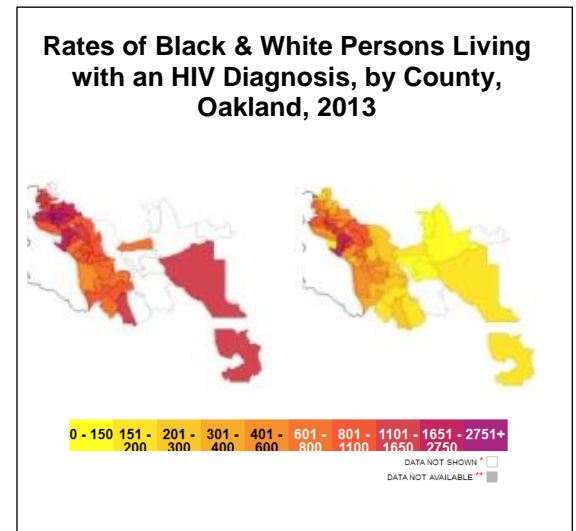


HIV in Oakland

HIV Landscape

According to the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), there are more than 119,845 people living with an HIV diagnosis in California. Below is a snapshot of the epidemic in Oakland:

- People living with HIV in Oakland (2013): 5,404
- New HIV diagnoses in California (2015): 4,720
- New HIV diagnoses in Oakland (2014): 199
- 82% of people living with an HIV diagnosis in Oakland in 2013 were men, 18% were women
- 43% of people living with an HIV diagnosis in Oakland in 2013 were black, 17% Hispanic/Latino, and 32% white
- In 2013, 73.4% of Oakland-area HIV cases in men were from male-to-male sexual contact, 6.1% were from injection drug use, and 6.5% were from injection drug use and male to male sexual contact
- In 2013, 63.6% of Oakland-area HIV cases in women were from heterosexual contact, and 18.8% were from injection drug use



The Importance of HIV Testing

The U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) estimates that more than 1.1 million people in the United States are living with HIV, yet nearly 1 in 7 people living with HIV are unaware of their status. In the United States, the Black community bears the greatest burden of the HIV epidemic, more than any other racial or ethnic group. While African Americans represent just 12% of the total population, they account for 41% of all people living with HIV and 44% of all new infections. All people should know their HIV status, but many do not.

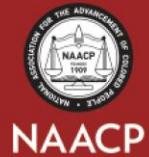
Experts recommend voluntary, opt-out routine HIV screening in health-care settings for all adults, and repeat screening at least annually for those at high risk. Pregnant women and newborns whose mother's HIV status is unknown should also be tested.

The U.S. Preventive Services Task Force gives a "Grade A" recommendation for HIV testing for everyone 15 to 65 years old. Younger adolescents and older adults with increased risk should also be tested. This means, under the Affordable Care Act, insurers will be required to cover HIV screening. This is in line with the 2006 CDC HIV testing recommendations, and is a positive step forward in making HIV screening a routine medical practice.
