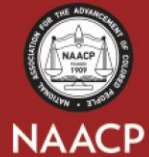

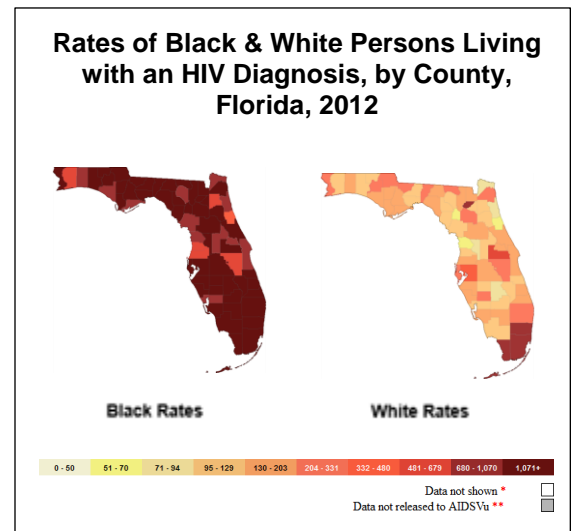


HIV in Ft. Lauderdale

HIV Landscape

According to the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), there are more than 101,452 people living with an HIV diagnosis in Florida. Below is a snapshot of the epidemic in Ft. Lauderdale:

- People living with HIV in Ft. Lauderdale (2013): 16,805
- New HIV diagnoses in Florida (2014): 5,332
- New HIV diagnoses in Ft. Lauderdale (2014): 962
- 71% of people living with an HIV diagnosis in Ft. Lauderdale in 2013 were men, 29% were women
- 49% of people living with an HIV diagnosis in Ft. Lauderdale in 2013 were black, 14% Hispanic/Latino, and 34% white
- In 2013, 63.6% of Ft. Lauderdale-area HIV cases in men were from male-to-male sexual contact, 4.7% were from injection drug use, and 3.5% were from injection drug use and male to male sexual contact
- In 2013, 74.8% of Ft. Lauderdale-area HIV cases in women were from heterosexual contact, and 8.8% were from injection drug use



The Importance of HIV Testing

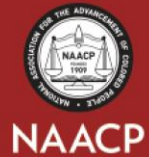
The U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) estimates that more than 1.2 million people in the United States are living with HIV, yet nearly 1 in 7 (14%) people living with HIV are unaware of their status. In fact, African Americans are most affected by HIV and account for an estimated 44% of all new HIV infections in the U.S. All people should know their HIV status, but many do not.

Experts recommend voluntary, opt-out routine HIV screening in health-care settings for all adults, and repeat screening at least annually for those at high risk. Pregnant women and newborns whose mother's HIV status is unknown should also be tested.

The U.S. Preventive Services Task Force gives a "Grade A" recommendation for HIV testing for everyone 15 to 65 years old. Younger adolescents and older adults with increased risk should also be tested. This means, under the Affordable Care Act, insurers will be required to cover HIV screening. This is in line with the 2006 CDC HIV testing recommendations, and is a positive step forward in making HIV screening a routine medical practice.
